1. Safeguarding and Safety Actions

Mr Ben Bramwell – Vice Principal

- Two external audits have taken place Local Authority and DfE Lead
- Support meeting with Bolton DCS and Safeguarding Team taken place
- Safeguarding improvement plan devised and started to be implemented
- Changes made to processes for recording and responding to concerns
- INSET Day on 17th April for staff training in latest safeguarding approaches
- Daily safeguarding 'triage' meetings taking place to assess any reported concerns
- Expert Lead support for UCS from DfE Lead and Bolton LA
- Safefguarding contacts list simplified and communicated across the school
- Full assemblies with each year group to make clear who to go to with concerns
- Safeguarding Week student activities planned for after Easter.

2. Behaviour & Attitudes

Mr Ben Bramwell – Vice Principal

- New simplified and clearer Behaviour Policy devised and consulted upon
- Raised expectations of 'professional' behaviours for all students
- Focus on behaviour for learning and much more recognition of good and excellent expected behaviours
- 'Re-launch MCAS App so parents can clearly see good behaviours as well as sanctions
- Rewards emphasis students consulted with to agree meaningful rewards
- Centralised Consequences with interventions clearly defined detentions after school
- Alternative curriculum pathways established for some learners to help regulate and improve their engagement in learning



Behaviour in lessons

"Destination focused – we know where we are going."

- Show respect to teachers and each other
- Do not shout out or talk when someone else is talking
- Use IPADs only when directed by a member of staff
- Complete all work to the best of your ability





2. Movement around school

"Work ready – to learn the knowledge and skills we need in the future."

- Take the most direct route to your lesson
- Arrive at your lesson on time
- Walk safely and quietly
- Respect others' personal space
- Follow staff instructions immediately





Taking care of our community

"Professional – we expect the same as employers."

- Treat all members of our community with respect
- Wear your uniform correctly at all times
- Respect the school environment
- Bring the correct equipment, including charged IPAD to school
- Mobile phones are not allowed in school





Behaviour at break and lunchtimes

"Professional – we expect the same as employers."

- Sit down on a chair whilst eating in the Bistro
- Use good manners when you order your food or speak to Bistro staff
- Clear up after yourself
- Stay in the allowed areas
- Behave sensibly and safely on the playgrounds


Sanctions – what do parents want?

3. Curriculum and Learning



Mrs Catherine Baggaley - Vice Principal

- Full curriculum entitlement model will be in place from Easter
- New subjects introduced into KS 3 Art, History, Citizenship, Personal Development
- Times of lessons / day will change from 6 to 5 lessons a day (50m to 1hr)
- Study support sessions for Y11 in place and smaller classes from Easter
- Moving from a confusing two-week timetable to a clear weekly one
- MCAS app being redesigned to show parents homework being set
- Calendar of Parents Evenings with staff have been re-established
- Framework for 'great Learning & Teaching' to ensure consistent teaching in class
- HoDs now given time to plan engaging, sequenced Schemes of work for students needs
- Partnership work with good and outstanding local schools taking place
- Staffing review and change specialist teachers being employed to fill vacancies
- New staff adverts to bring into UCS 8-10 teachers for September 2023
- Alternative Curriculum pathways in place to help some learners re-engage
- Lunchtimes while shorter will have more food outlets in place and more activities
