Component 2: Thematic studies

What's assessed

Either four religious, philosophical and ethical studies themes or two religious, philosophical and ethical studies themes and two textual studies themes

Religious, philosophical and ethical studies themes:

- Theme A: Relationships and families.
- · Theme B: Religion and life.
- · Theme C: The existence of God and revelation. Theme D: Religion, peace and conflict.
- Theme E: Religion, crime and punishment Theme F: Religion, human rights and social justice.

Textual studies themes:

· Theme G: St Mark's Gospel - the life of Jesus. Theme H: St Mark's Gospel as a source of religious, moral and spiritual truths.

How it's assessed




