

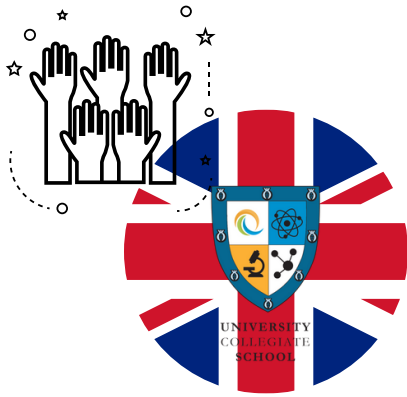

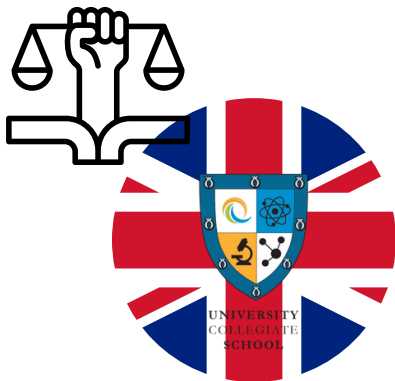
# BRITISH VALUES AT UCS

A state of society, characterised by equality of rights and privileges for all citizens. It can refer to the right to vote for a government in elections that are free and fair.



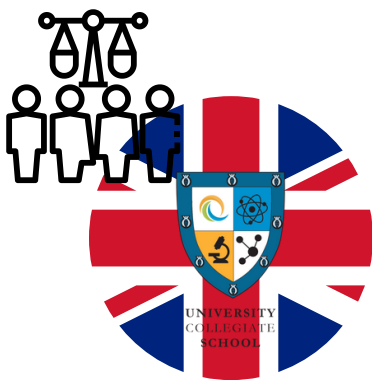
## INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY

As long as you are following the law you can live as you choose to and have the ability to make your own choices and understand the rewards or consequences of our own actions.



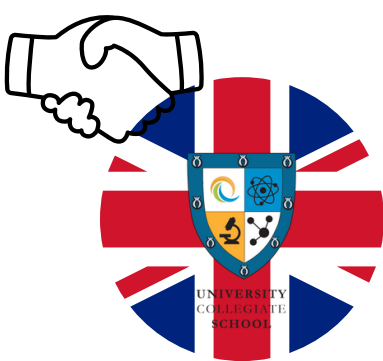
## TOLERANCE
